

## MAC High Curriculum

**Noitacude:** Is a mandatory class held 5 times throughout the week. Hosted by our fun loving nurses, they always come up with fun new ways to learn about bleeding disorders! They're also known for having a special guest speaker or two!

**Aquatics:** Is a mandatory class held 5 times throughout the week and encourages cooling off on a hot summer day in our beautiful pool with a variety of activities and pool toys.

**Physical Active Lifestyle (PAL):** Is a mandatory class held 5 times throughout the week. You will explore nature and keep fit via archery, ropes course, rockwalls and more!
